

Worksheet for Additional Majors

Under certain circumstances it may be possible for a student to earn more than one undergraduate major or degree. It is expected that the programs be significantly different from each other and that approval be received prior to the student's senior year. Use this worksheet to help determine if you meet the criteria.

- I DO NOT YET HAVE SENIOR STANDING.
- ADDING A MAJOR WILL NOT EXTEND MY TIME TO GRADUATION.
- I WILL COMPLETE AT LEAST 15 CREDITS IN **EACH** MAJOR THAT DO NOT OVERLAP WITH EACH OTHER, NOR WITH ANY COLLEGE OR UNIVERSITY REQUIREMENTS. I HAVE LISTED THESE COURSES IN THE TABLE BELOW. Note that some majors may contain *more* than 15 credits that do not overlap. You need only document 15 credits, not all unique credits. It is often easiest to begin at the end of each curriculum (e.g., with the Capstone course) and work backwards until reaching 15 credits.
